Ord. 034-21:

An Ordinance authorizing the payment to Software Solutions, Inc. (SSI) for annual support services for the City's VIP Professional Accounting System. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 034-21, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Shields moved that the emergency clause be added to Ordinance/Resolution No. 034-21, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Dirham stated this is their renewal with SSI and the emergency clause is needed because the effective period begins March 1st. The roll was called on adding the emergency clause and was approved by the yea votes of P. Rose, J. Shields, J. Coyne, J. Hazeltine, E. Heffinger, and B. Lamb. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 034-21 passed by the yea votes of J. Shields, J. Coyne, J. Hazeltine, E. Heffinger, B. Lamb, and P. Rose.

Res. 035-21:

A Resolution donating used Medina TV and City of Medina equipment to Medina County. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 035-21, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Fry stated this is for equipment that used to reside here in the rotunda before the renovation project. Instead of sending it to auction for pennies on the dollar, they would like to donate it to the County Commissioners in which they are working on a memo of understanding at this point to use this equipment and hopefully to continue an agreement to televise their meetings. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 035-21 passed by the yea votes of J. Coyne, J. Hazeltine, E. Heffinger, B. Lamb, P. Rose, and J. Shields.

Res. 036-21:

A Resolution authorizing an Application for Grant Assistance from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) for FAA CRRSAA Airport Funding. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 036-21, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Shields moved that the emergency clause be added to Ordinance/Resolution No. 036-21, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Patton stated this is their second award from COVID relief funds from the Federal Government. Last year we received \$30,000 in funding for the airport and this year we are eligible to receive \$13,000.00. Emergency clause is being requested because the FAA intends on beginning distribution of these funds in mid-March. The roll was called on adding the emergency clause and was approved by the yea votes of J. Hazeltine, E. Heffinger, B. Lamb, P. Rose, J. Shields, and J. Coyne. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 036-21 passed by the yea votes of E. Heffinger, B. Lamb, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, and J. Hazeltine.

Ord. 037-21:

An Ordinance authorizing the expenditure of \$10,000.00 to the Medina County Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (SPCA) for animal related services for the year of 2021. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 037-21, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Rose stated that Medina City does not have an animal warden and the SPCA does provide us a service in helping us rid the city of unwanted animals. This is our contribution to help them with their over \$300,000.00 budget they have every year. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 037-21 passed by the yea votes of B. Lamb, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, J. Hazeltine, and E. Heffinger.

Ord. 038-21:

An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 3-21, passed January 11, 2021, relative to the purchase of one (1) 2021 Ford Explorer from Lebanon Ford for the Police Department. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 038-21, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Shields moved that the emergency clause be added to Ordinance/Resolution No. 038-21, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Chief Kinney stated this is an increase, the state bid transferred at the beginning of the year and it was during their council process and meanwhile the dealership has increased the price by the requested amount \$481.60. The emergency clause is requested so that is no additional delays. The roll was called on adding the emergency clause and was approved by the yea votes of P. Rose, J. Shields, J. Coyne, J. Hazeltine, E. Heffinger, and B. Lamb. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 038-21 passed by the yea votes of J. Shields, J. Coyne, J. Hazeltine, E. Heffinger, B. Lamb, and P. Rose.

Council Comments:

Mr. Shields officially welcomed Chief Walters. He stated he had the honor of sitting in on his interview, and from a very impressive group of candidates, Larry rose to the top. Congratulations and good luck, the department is in good hands.

ORDINANCE NO. 39-21

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING WITH THE MEDINA COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS AND THE CITY OF MEDINA, FOR MEDINA TV PRODUCTION SERVICES OF COUNTY PROGRAMMING, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MEDINA, OHIO:

- SEC. 1: That the Mayor is hereby authorized and directed to execute a Memorandum of Understanding with the Medina County Board of Commissioners for Medina TV to provide presentation of local meetings involving the County of Medina, and additional issues involving local County government, commencing on February 25, 2021.
- SEC. 2: That a copy of the Memorandum of Understanding is marked Exhibit A, attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- SEC. 5: That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with the law.
- SEC. 6: That this Ordinance shall be considered an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, and for the further reason this Memorandum of Understanding is effective February 25, 2021; wherefore, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage and signature by the Mayor.

- 1. <u>Background</u>. The City of Medina manages television programming known as Medina TV; local government access is provided by Medina TV as a result of television broadcasting of local government meetings and other television programming that involves local government officials, government employees, and other issues related to local government. The City of Medina and the Medina County Board of County Commissioners wish to enter into agreement for presentation of local meetings involving the County of Medina and additional issues involving local county government. Medina TV is currently in a position to provide a broadcasting service to the County of Medina so as to broaden government access television programming.
- 2. <u>Scope of Service</u>. The City of Medina and Medina TV agree to provide staff for the benefit of the Medina County Commissioners so as to produce and broadcast Medina County Commissioners' meetings. Medina TV will provide the staff and the initial equipment necessary to complete the television broadcast of Medina County Commissioners' meetings. Medina TV will, in addition, distribute and air any rebroadcast of the aforementioned Medina County Commissioners' meetings.
- 3. <u>Compensation</u>. As compensation for services rendered by the City of Medina and Medina TV pursuant to this Agreement, the County of Medina agrees to pay to Medina TV personnel an hourly rate of Fifty-Two Dollars (\$52) per hour for each hour that Medina TV staff work in the taping and production of Medina County Commissioners' meetings. The Fifty-two (\$52) per hour charge shall also apply to any additional programming and production services associated with the broadcast of Medina County Commissioners' meetings. The City of Medina shall submit an invoice to the County of Medina on a quarterly basis for all services rendered during the preceding quarterly billing period, and the County of Medina will make payment within thirty (30) days after receipt of said invoice.

There may be an additional equipment use rate assessed for services rendered pursuant to this Agreement dependent upon the scope of work requested by the County of Medina. The additional equipment use rate shall be agreed upon, in writing, in advance by the City of Medina and the County of Medina.

4. <u>Capital Improvement</u>. The Medina County Board of County Commissioners shall establish and maintain a Ten Thousand Dollar (\$10,000) capital improvement fund for purchase of new equipment and maintenance of equipment used in the broadcast and production of Medina County government access programming and used in the broadcast of Medina County Commissioners' meetings. The use of monies from the capital improvement fund shall be agreed upon by the parties, in writing, so as to meet future technology needs. The Medina County

Board of County Commissioners shall promptly carry out purchases agreed to in writing by the parties.

- 5. <u>Term</u>. The term of this Agreement shall commence on February 25, 2021, which is the date Medina TV began to render services to the County of Medina, and terminate within a period of one (1) year after the date of the signing of this Agreement. This Agreement will automatically renew from year to year unless the party that desires to terminate the agreement at the end of the term provides ninety (90) days' written notice before the end of the then current term.
- 6. <u>Termination</u>. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon ninety (90) days' written notice to the other party. Termination shall not prejudice any remedy that the terminating party may have at law or in equity.
- 7. <u>Effect of Termination upon Compensation</u>. If this Agreement is terminated prior to the completion of the term specified in this Agreement, the City of Medina shall be entitled to compensation earned prior to the date of termination as provided for in this Agreement completed upon a pro rata basis. The City of Medina shall be entitled to no further compensation as of the date of termination. Funds in the capital improvement fund will be reimbursed to the party that paid it.
- 8. <u>Agreement Review</u>. This Agreement will be evaluated on a yearly basis by the City of Medina, the County of Medina, and Medina TV. Any alterations to this Agreement shall be discussed and completed in writing as necessary. This Agreement may be renewed upon written agreement of the parties.

ORDINANCE NO. 41-21

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 31.14 (L) OF THE SALARIES AND BENEFITS CODE OF THE CITY OF MEDINA, OHIO RELATIVE TO SICK LEAVE.

WHEREAS: Section 31.14 (L) of the Salaries and Benefits Code of the City of Medina, Ohio presently reads as follows:

SECTION 31.14 SICK LEAVE.

(L) A City employee may elect, at the time of retirement from the active service and with ten (10) or more years of service with the City, to be paid in cash for 37.5% of the value of his accrued but unused sick leave credit. Such payment shall be based on the employee's rate of pay at the time of retirement. Payment for sick leave credit on this basis shall be considered to eliminate all sick leave credit accrued by the employee at the time. Such payment shall be made only once to any employee. The maximum payment that may be made under this section shall be four hundred (400) hours. (Ord. 97-14)

In the event of the death of a full time employee, the estate may request payment for 37.5% of the value of the accrued but unused sick leave credit as described above provided the employee has five (5) or more years of service with the City. The maximum payment that may be made under this section shall be four hundred hours (400 hours). (Ord. 97-14)

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MEDINA, OHIO:

SEC. 1: That Section 31.14 (L) of the Salaries and Benefits Code of the City of Medina, Ohio shall be amended to read as follows (with the new addition in bold & underlined):

SECTION 31.14 SICK LEAVE.

(L) A City employee providing two-weeks notification and continuing to work that two-week period, may elect, at the time of retirement and/or resignation from active service with the City and with ten (10) or more years of full-time service with the City, to be paid in cash for 37.5% of the value of his accrued but unused sick leave credit. Such payment shall be based on the employee's rate of pay at the time of retirement. Payment for sick leave credit on this basis shall be considered to eliminate all sick leave credit accrued by the employee at the time. Such payment shall be made only once to any employee. The maximum payment that may be made under this section shall be four hundred (400) hours. (Ord. 97-14, Ord. 41-21)

In the event of the death of a full time employee, the estate may request payment for 37.5% of the value of the accrued but unused sick leave credit as described above provided the employee has five (5) or more years of service with the City. The maximum payment that may be made under this section shall be four hundred hours (400 hours). (Ord. 97-14)

CONTRACT

(Chapter 5521, Ohio Revised Code)

This contract is made by and between the State of Ohio, Department of Transportation, acting through its director (hereinafter referred to as the "STATE"), 1980 West Broad Street, Columbus, Ohio 43223, and the City of **Medina**, (hereinafter referred to as the legislative authority/Local Public Agency or "LPA").

WITNESSTH:

WHEREAS, Chapter 5521 of the Ohio Revised Code provides that the legislative authority may cooperate with the STATE in a highway project made by and under the supervision of the Director of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, through the enactment of preliminary legislation, the LPA and the STATE have agreed to cooperate in the highway project described below; and

WHEREAS, through the enactment of final legislation, the LPA has committed to pay an estimated amount of money as its share of the total estimated cost and expense of the highway project described below; and

WHEREAS, the fiscal officer of the LPA has filed with the LPA a certificate stating that sufficient moneys are available, as required by Chapter 5521 and Section 5705.41 of the Ohio Revised Code. A duplicate certificate is attached hereto; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the final legislation, the LPA hereby enters into this contract with the STATE to provide for payment of the agreed portion of the cost of the highway project and any additional obligations for the highway project described below.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the performances of mutual covenants hereinafter set forth, it is agreed by parties hereto as follows:

SECTION I: RECITALS

The foregoing recitals are hereby incorporated as a material part of this contract.

SECTION II: PURPOSE

The purpose of this contract is to set forth requirements associated with the highway project described below (hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT") and to establish the responsibilities for the administration of the PROJECT by the LPA and the STATE.

SECTION III: LEGAL REFERENCES

This contract is established pursuant to Chapter 5521 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION IV: SCOPE OF WORK

The work to be performed under this contract shall consist of the following:

The project consists of the widening and reconstruction of S.R. 18 between approximately 320 feet west of Alber Drive and the easternmost Medina corporation limit and the construction of a 10-foot multi-use path, including sidewalk, curb ramps, drainage, water work, a structure, a culvert, traffic signals, signage, and pavement markings, lying within the City of Medina.

SECTION V: FINANCIAL PARTICIPATION

- 1. The STATE agrees to provide the necessary funds as enumerated in this section and allowed by law for the financing of this project.
- 2. The STATE may allocate the money contributed by the LPA in whatever manner it deems necessary in financing the cost of construction, right-of-way, engineering, and incidental expenses, notwithstanding the percentage basis of contribution by the LPA.
- 3. The total cost and expenses for the project are only an estimate and the total cost and expenses may be adjusted by the STATE. If any adjustments are required, payment of additional funds shall correspond with the percentages of actual costs when said actual costs are determined, and as requested, by the Director of Transportation.
- 4. The LPA agrees to pay to the STATE its share of the total estimated cost expense for the above highway project in the amount of **Seventy Thousand Two Hundred Ten and ----00/100 Dollars**, (\$70,210.00).
- 5. The City agrees to assume and bear one hundred percent (100%) of the entire cost of the improvement within the city limits, less the amount of Federal-Aid funds set aside by the Director of Transportation for the financing of this improvement from funds allocated by the Federal Highway Administration, U. S. Department of Transportation.
- 6. The LPA agrees to assume and bear One Hundred Percent (100%) of the cost of any construction items required by the LPA on the entire project, which are not necessary for the improvement, as determined by the State and Federal Highway Administration.
- 7. The LPA agrees that change orders and extra work contracts required fulfilling the construction contracts shall be processed as needed. The STATE shall not approve a change order or extra work contract until it first gives notice, in writing, to the LPA. The LPA shall contribute its share of the cost of these items in accordance with other sections herein.

SECTION VI: RIGHT-OF-WAY AND UTILITIES

- 1. The LPA agrees that all right-of-way required for the described project will be acquired and/or made available in accordance with current State and Federal regulations. The LPA also understands that right-of-way costs include eligible utility costs.
- 2. The LPA agrees that all utility accommodation, relocation, and reimbursement will comply with the current provisions of 23 CFR 645 and the ODOT Utilities Manual, including that:
 - A. Arrangements have been or will be made with all utilities where facilities are affected by the described PROJECT, that the utilities have agreed to make all necessary removals and/or relocations to clear any construction called for by the plans of this PROJECT, and that the utilities have agreed to make the necessary removals and/or relocations after notification by the LPA or STATE.
 - B. The LPA shall, at its own expense, make all removals and/or relocations of publicly-owned utilities which do not comply with the reimbursement provisions of the ODOT Utilities Manual. Publicly-owned facilities which do comply with the reimbursement provisions of the ODOT Utilities Manual will be removed and/or relocated at project expense, exclusive of betterments.
 - C. The removals and/or relocation of all utilities shall be done in such a manner as not to interfere with the operation of the contractor constructing the PROJECT and that the utility removals and/or relocations shall be approved by the STATE and performed in accordance with the provisions of the ODOT Construction and Materials Specifications.

SECTION VII: ADDITIONAL PROJECT OBLIGATIONS

- 1. The STATE shall initiate the competitive bid letting process and award the PROJECT in accordance with ODOT's policies and procedures.
- 2. The LPA agrees:
 - A. To keep said highway open to traffic at all times;
 - B. To maintain the PROJECT in accordance with the provisions of the statutes relating thereto,
 - C. To make ample financial and other provisions for such maintenance of the PROJECT after its completion;
 - D. To maintain the right-of-way and keep it free of obstructions in a manner satisfactory to the STATE and hold said right-of-way inviolate for public highway purposes;

- E. To place and maintain all traffic control devices conforming to the Ohio Manual of Uniform Traffic Control Devices on the project in compliance with the provisions of Section 4511.11 of the Ohio Revised Code;
- F. To regulate parking in accordance with Section 4511.66 of the Ohio Revised Code, unless otherwise controlled by local ordinance or resolution.

SECTION VIII: DISPUTES

In the event that any disputes arise between the STATE and LPA concerning interruption of or performance pursuant to this contract, such disputes shall be resolved solely and finally by the Director of Transportation.

To the extent necessary under Ohio law, LPA agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause. LPA will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of LPA, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, religion, color, sex, national origin (ancestry), disability, genetic information, age (40 years or older), sexual orientation, or military status (past, present, future). If applicable, the LPA shall incorporate the foregoing requirements of this paragraph in all of its contracts for any of the work prescribed herein (other than subcontracts for standard commercial supplies or raw materials) and will require all of its subcontractors for any part of such work to incorporate such requirements in all subcontracts for such work.

3. LPA agrees to fully comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 USC Sec. 2000. LPA shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, or national origin in its programs or activities. The Director of Transportation may monitor the Contractor's compliance with Title VI.

SECTION XI: GENERAL PROVISIONS

- 1. This contract constitutes the entire contract between the parties. All prior discussions and understandings between the parties are superseded by this contract.
- 2. Neither this contract nor any rights, duties or obligations described herein shall be assigned by either party hereto without the prior express written consent of the other party.
- 3. Any change to the provisions of this contract must be made in a written amendment executed by both parties.
- 4. This contract and any claims arising out of this contract shall be governed by the laws of the State of Ohio. Any provision of this contract prohibited by the law of Ohio shall be deemed void and of no effect. Any litigation arising out of or relating in any way to this contract or the performance thereunder shall be brought only in the courts of Ohio, and the LPA hereby irrevocably consents to such jurisdiction. To the extent that the STATE is a party to any litigation arising out of or relating in any way to this contract or the performance thereunder, such an action shall be brought only in a court of competent jurisdiction in Franklin County, Ohio.
- 5. All financial obligations of the State of Ohio, as provided in this contract, are subject to the provisions of Section 126.07 of the Ohio Revised Code. The financial obligations of the State of Ohio shall not be valid and enforceable unless funds are appropriated by the Ohio General Assembly and encumbered by the STATE. Additionally, it is understood that this financial obligation of the LPA shall not be valid and enforceable unless funds are appropriated by the LPA's legislative body.
- 6. This contract shall be deemed to have been substantially performed only when fully performed according to its terms and conditions and any modification thereof.
- 7. LPA agrees that it is currently in compliance and will continue to adhere to the requirements of Ohio Ethics law as provided by Section 102.03 and 102.04 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Any person executing this contract in a representative capacity hereby warrants that he/she has been duly authorized by his/her principal to execute this contract on such principal behalf.
