Call to Order:

Medina City Council met in regular session on Monday, May 13, 2024 at Medina City Hall. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by President of Council John M. Coyne III, who also led in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chief Kinney, Police Department, acknowledged recognitions for School Resource Officer Nick MacLarren was awarded "Going the Extra Mile Award" he serves at MHS and has for several years.

Dispatcher Patrick Villanuevo will receive the EMS Star Life Award in Columbus for an animal attack call that he took that was occurring in Medina Township.

Chief Walters, Fire Department, had no report.

Jansen Wehrley, Parks and Recreation Director, was absent.

Dan Gladish, Building Official, Dan updated everyone on two of the larger projects taking place. The Acme sitework and underground utility work is taking place now, they have the building permit and plan approval for the building.

The Meijer project is ahead of schedule. Parking lot has been ground up and asphalt is gone and will be recycled on the site for backfill for trenches and compaction. Working on building the building pad now. Goal is to start to reinstall the parking lot by the end of July, and all landscaping

will be in place first week in October.

Nino Piccoli, Service Director, had no report.

Patrick Patton, City Engineer, reported that ODOT one more major phase of the State Route 18 project and that is placing the surface course of asphalt starting the week of Memorial Day and will be done at night.

Andrew Dutton, Planning and Community Development Director, reported updates that were approved by the Boards and Commissions last Thursday. Medina Metropolitan Housing Authority was approved for an eleven-unit multifamily development. The second is the hotel and convention center project both received approval and will be moving on to building permit and engineering review.

Introduction of Visitors:

Darin Stout - Director of Medina County Drug Task Force

Only Drug Enforcement Agency body within Medina County and serve as the drug agency for each of the 14 law enforcement agencies throughout the county and are 100% grant funded.

There were 200 felony investigations that occurred last year. Participated in 495 calls for service. They have been in the process of beefing up their outreach and harm reduction strategies as a collaborative approach with the Drug Task Force to start with their DUMP Program (Dispose Unused Medications Properly) and the National Drug Take Back. They have collected more than 20,000 lbs. of unwanted prescriptions this year alone.

Since 2020, The Drug Task Force along with the collaborative partners in law enforcement, treatment, and service providers have reduced the fatal overdose rate by 48.71%.

Introduction and consideration of ordinances and resolutions

Mr. Shields moved to suspend the rules requiring three readings on the following ordinances and resolutions, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Haire, J. Hazeltine, and P. Rose

Ord. 91-24

An Ordinance amending Section 31.13 of the Salaries and Benefits Code of the City of Medina, Ohio relative to Vacation. Mr. Shields moved to amend Ordinance 91-24 before voting that anybody who leaves within one year of their initial employment would not be paid out vacation which is not currently in this ordinance. Mr. Shields moved for the amended adoption of

Ordinance/Resolution No. 091-24, seconded by Mr. Simpson. The roll was called on the amendment and passed by the yea votes of J. Coyne, N. DiSalvo, R. Haire, J. Hazeltine, P. Rose, J. Shields, and D. Simpson. Keith Dirham stated this ordinance as it currently is set up, employees of the City of Medina do not receive any vacation until their one-year anniversary date, it is not calendar year it is their anniversary hire date. The purpose of this amendment is to be able to give people that are starting their vacation time a little sooner and this will make it so they begin accruing vacation on day one but if they leave within a year they won't be paid for it. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 091-24 as amended passed by the yea votes of D. Simpson, J. Coyne, N. DiSalvo, R. Haire, J. Hazeltine, P. Rose, and J. Shields.

Ord. 92-24

An Ordinance authorizing the Job Creation Grant Agreement for Sandridge Food Corporation. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 092-24, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Kimberly Marshall stated this is for a renovation to their facility located at 820 Lafayette Rd. to allow for their expanded sales and marketing depts. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 092-24 passed by the yea votes of J. Coyne, N. DiSalvo, R. Haire, J. Hazeltine, P. Rose, J. Shields, and D. Simpson.

Res. 93-24

A Resolution authorizing participation in the Ohio Department of Transportation's Cooperative Purchasing Program for the purchase of sodium chloride (rock salt). Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 093-24, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Shields moved that the emergency clause be added to Ordinance/Resolution No. 093-24, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Piccoli stated he received this notification to participate in the upcoming winter salt program with ODOT on short notice and that is why he needs the emergency clause. This is for the annual road salt. The roll was called on adding the emergency clause and was approved by the yea votes of N. DiSalvo, R. Haire, J. Hazeltine, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, and J. Coyne. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 093-24 passed by the yea votes of R. Haire, J. Hazeltine, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, and N. DiSalvo.

Res. 94-24

A Resolution authorizing the Mayor to submit a grant application to the Ohio Bureau of Workers Compensation (OBWC) for the purpose of purchasing two (2) portable traffic signal units. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 094-24, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Piccoli stated if they are successful with this grant application it will become available in July and is for \$40,000 towards the purchase of two portable lights. We would be responsible for \$23,000 since the total cost will be \$63,000. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 094-24 passed by the yea votes of J. Hazeltine, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, N. DiSalvo, and R. Haire.

Res. 95-24

A Resolution authorizing an application for grant assistance from the Medina County Drug Abuse Commission (MCDAC) for funding to support the Medina Police Department School Resource Officer Program. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 095-24, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Shields moved that the emergency clause be added to

Ordinance/Resolution No. 095-24, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Chief Kinney stated this is to submit the MCDAC Grant and accept if awarded. This is a collaboration between the Medina Police Dept. and the City Schools. There are 3 school resource officers and if this is awarded it will fund a portion of their salaries. The emergency clause is needed because of time restraints. The roll was called on adding the emergency clause and was approved by the yea votes of P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, N. DiSalvo, R. Haire, and J. Hazeltine. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 095-24 passed by the yea votes of J. Shields, D. Simpson, J. Coyne, N. DiSalvo, R. Haire, J. Hazeltine, and P. Rose

Ord. 96-24

An Ordinance amending Ordinance No. 194-14, passed November 24, 2024, relative to the Job Creation Grant Program Guidelines and Application. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 096-24, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Kimberly Marshall stated this Job Creation Grant Program offers an incentive to eligible companies to establish or expand their business here in the City of Medina and to create and retain jobs. In 2014 council modified the program to allow for smaller eligible businesses to take advantage of the program. A new company was able to meet the payroll but the job number was a little bit lower than our 10-threshold number. The Economic Development Committee recommended revising the program to reflect the number of jobs which has been reduced from creating 10 new jobs to 5 new jobs but keep payroll the same. Kimberly stated they cleaned up some other items in the job creation grant guidelines. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 096-24 passed by the yea votes of D. Simpson, J. Coyne, N. DiSalvo, R. Haire, J. Hazeltine, P. Rose, and J. Shields.

Ord. 97-24

An Ordinance amending Section 943.11 of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Medina, Ohio relative to the Schedule of Charges and Fees for Spring Grove Cemetery and repealing Ordinance No. 181-21, passed November 8, 2021. Mr. Shields moved for the adoption of Ordinance/Resolution No. 097-24, seconded by Mr. Simpson. Mr. Piccoli spoke for Jansen stating we need to amend the cost for the columbarium niche in order to prepare for the construction of a fourth wall. Talked about requesting increase for lot transfer fee, the increase per footer foundation fee, adding administration fee for all columbarium niches sold back to the city and a fee for the replacement niche covers. The roll was called and Ordinance/Resolution No. 097-24 passed by the yea votes of J. Coyne, N. DiSalvo, R. Haire, J. Hazeltine, P. Rose, J. Shields, and D. Simpson.

Council comments

Natalie DiSalvo mentioned with the end of the school year approaching she wanted to remind the community to please be extra careful when driving around. As Memorial Day quickly approaches, she also thanked veterans for their service.

Regi Haire gave a shout out to the Friends of the Cemetery stating that Spring Grove Cemetery is beautiful, and she encouraged the community to attend the Gospel Fest being held on the square on May 18th from 3 p.m. to 8 p.m.

Paul Rose congratulated Chief Kinney.

Executive Session: (land acquisition / imminent litigation)

It was moved by Mr. Shields and seconded by Mr. Simpson to enter into Executive Session at 8:01 p.m. to consider the purchase of property for public purposes or the sale of property at competitive bidding because premature disclosure would give an unfair competitive or bargaining advantage to a person who's personal, private interest is averse to the general public interest, and for conferences with the City's Law Director concerning disputes involving the City which are the subject of pending or imminent court action, to include the Mayor and Law Director. The roll was called and motion passed by the yea votes of N. DiSalvo, R. Haire, J. Hazeltine, P. Rose, J. Shields, D. Simpson, and J. Coyne.

Executive session adjourned at 8:24 p.m. There being no further business, the City Council meeting adjourned at 8:25 p.m.
