Water Main Improvement Project to Impact Traffic and Parking

Beginning the week of September 1st, the contractor will begin con-restoration work along West Liberty Street, South Elmwood Avenue West Washington Street. This work will include the replacement of curbs, sidewalks, curb ramps, drive aprons, and pavement that was turbed with the installation of the new water main associated with project.

For the week of September 1st traffic along West Liberty Street, South Elmwood Avenue and West Washington Street will be re-opened fully to traffic; however, there may be occasional short term lane closures while concrete replacement work is occurring. In these instances traffic will be maintained with flaggers. Schedule is weather dependent.
